

100 MEN CLUB - provide special donation to Houston orphanage devastated by hurricane Harvey ... in partnership with 100 Men Who Give a Damn Houston.

DETROIT, MI — November 6, 2017 — 100 Men Club, a recently formed group of local men committed to making a positive difference within Metro Detroit communities and their families, announced its special donation to Boys & Girls Harbor for \$2,500.

At their September meeting, 100 Men Club member Todd Konet proposed that in addition to the customary selection process of a charity for donation from three nominations, that a “special collection” be taken up to support a worthy cause in the Houston area following the effects of Hurricane Harvey. He then reached out to a similar organization, 100 Men Who Give a Damn Houston for ideas. “Not knowing where our donation would do the most good; I asked the like-minded men in the Houston group to decide the recipient for us,” said Konet.

Dave Lee, Founder of 100 Men Who Give a Damn Houston, replied that there was an immediate need at Boys and Girls Harbor, a Houston area home that provides comprehensive residential care for children and families in crisis.

Serving the Greater Houston Metropolitan Area, Boys & Girls Harbor is a 501(c)(3) non-profit home that welcomes children in need regardless of race, creed, color or financial status. Harbor facilities are licensed by the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services.

Upon learning of the \$2,500 donation to Boys & Girls Harbor from the 100 Men Club in Metro Detroit, Michigan, Don Sweat, the Harbor’s President & CEO commented, “Hurricane Harvey resulted in a number of our residential cottages taking on water with damages ranging from flooring to be replaced to roof leaks requiring repair work. Never did we anticipate a group of men committed to helping local families in the Metro Detroit area would expand their mission and philanthropy to help children over a 1,000 miles away in Morgan’s Point (metropolitan Houston), Texas. This special gift from the 100 Men Club means a great deal to us and to our children and will be used to help pay for needed repairs. A special thank you to all the members who made this donation possible.”

100 Men Club was founded in December 2016. The members range from recent college graduates to retirees, with the common intention to build a tradition of helping others. For each member, the positive energy and camaraderie of 100+ men with a sincere purpose to 'give back' is compelling and rewarding.

Founding member Keith Charron, commented that “100 Men Club is focused on those in our communities who are less fortunate or simply need a helping hand. This donation to Boys & Girls Harbor is a perfect example of the positive impact we can have on the human spirit. This is what we are all about.”
